## Flowers for Sunny Areas

**Anise Hyssop** 🦋 36" tall, purple spikes of flowers, blossoms in mid-summer, aromatic, used in gardens

**Aromatic Aster** 🦋 🐝 18" tall, purple flowers aug-oct; stiff stems will branch out slowly to create a bush-like appearance completely covered in flowers when blooming; prefers a dry to med soil

**Butterfly Milkweed** 🦋 🐝 24" tall, orange flowers in mid-summer; attracts butterflies; widely used in gardens

**Button Blazing Star** 🦋 🐝 36" tall, purple flowers July through Oct., attracts butterflies & hummingbirds, song birds eat the seeds. Also called Rough Blazing Star.

**Cardinal Flower** 🦋 🐝 30" flower stalk, brilliant red in late summer; attracts hummingbirds and swallowtail\_butterflies; likes moist rich soil

**Common Milkweed** 🦋 🐝 36" tall, white to pink flowers June-Aug, host plant for monarch caterpillars, easy to establish; med. to dry soil

**Meadow Blazing Star** 🦋 🐝 60" tall purple blooms in Aug-Sept; the height makes it an easy target for Monarchs/butterflies & birds to feed; in a formal garden setting you may want to stake the plants; med. Soil

**Ohio Spiderwort** 🐝 a very attractive addition to any garden; Its unusual foliage and tendency to bloom in the morning sun and close from mid-day heat and sun make this an attractive addition wherever it is found; are very adaptable tolerating sand, clay and other tough sites; deer resistant

**Prairie Blazing Star** 🦋 🐝 48" tall purple blooms in summer; an excellent species to plant in wet to med. soil; butterflies, bees, & hummingbirds are attracted to it all summer

**Rose Milkweed** 🦋 🐝 48" large heads of rose-pink blossoms in early fall; host plant for monarch caterpillars; moist to med. soil; Deer resistant

**Sweet Black-eyed Susan** 🦋 🐝 48" tall, yellow blossoms in late summer to early fall, long lived plant

**Sullivan's Milkweed** 🦋 🐝 36" tall, pink blooms in summer; this Milkweed appears generally similar to Common Milkweed but is less aggressive & has slightly smaller flowers; prefers med to moist soils

**White Wild Indigo** 🦋 🐝 36" tall, spreading annual 'bush', with striking spike of white pea blooms; in fall dries to black with 'pea pods' on stalk; This plant is popular with insects. Bumblebees pollinate the flowers and caterpillars of several skippers, butterflies and moths feed on the foliage. Deer resistant

**Wild Lupine** 🦋 24" tall, purple blooms May to July. This legume is essential to the life cycle of the Karner Blue butterfly, a federally-endangered species native to the Great Lakes region.

**Wild Strawberry** Not only do you get the early-summer white blossoms and edible fruit, but the Wild Strawberry plant takes on a great red fall color also; full sun to nearly full shade, prairie, meadows, fields, on moist ground, along the edge of woods, and on hillsides. The fruit ripens in late spring or early summer. They are much smaller than commercial strawberries but probably the most delicious of the wild fruits. Deer resistant

## Native Grasses

**Little Bluestem** 2' tall, fine leaves with beautiful seed heads and bronze fall color; widely used in gardens

**Northern Dropseed** 1' tall mound of fine leaves with 2' 'spray' of seed head; widely used in gardens

## Flowers for Shady Area

**Columbine** 🦋 🐝 24" tall, red blooms in spring, also grows in sun, great hummingbird feeder

**Jacob's Ladder** 12" tall, showy blue flowers in spring; med-med dry soils; deer resistant

**Short's Aster** 🦋 🐝 36" tall, pale blue-violet blooms Aug. to Oct.; an attractive inhabitant of dry woodlands & savannas; makes a great cut flower

**Virginia Bluebells** 18" tall, blue flowers, early in damp areas. Virginia Bluebells dies back in mid-summer making it a true spring ephemeral

**Wild Blue Phlox** 🦋 12" tall, blue flowers in May, med. to dry soils, deer resistant

**Wild Ginger** 12" tall, heart-shaped velvety green leaves, small flower near the ground. Good ground cover, deer resistant; prefers moist soils

## Ferns for Shady Area

**Ostrich Fern** 48" grows in a symmetric, vase-shaped clumps, prefers moist soil, deer & rabbit resistant, will spread
