Summer Staff:

The Friends of Quarry Hill Nature Center summer team includes our permanent staff and seasonal staff with education, science, and environmental education backgrounds. Enthusiasm, experience with children and knowledge of the natural world shine through in their interactions with campers.

In addition to staff, high school students join our team as camp leader assistants. High school assistants are students that have committed to complete a .5 credit independent study course requiring 60 hours assisting camp leaders.

AN ACTIVE OUTDOOR EXPERIENCE FOR ADVENTURERS AGES 4 TO 7 WITH AN ADULT

Jump, hop, fly and buzz your way up to the Oak Savanna with a Quarry Hill naturalist! We're rounding up adventurers, ages 4-7, and their adult sidekick for this premier experience. On this 90 minute adventure, naturalists will teach you how to use a bug net (that you get to keep!) and lead you in discovering the amazing world of insects.

Each adventurer will go home with their very own Quarry Hill bug hunt tote which includes a copy of the interactive book "Backpack Explorer: Bug Hunt," an insect net, a bug jar, and sweet honey bee treat.

This is an active outdoor experience where all activities are geared toward the abilities and interests of children 4 - 7 years of age and who are accompanied by a participating adult. Only children registered for the experience may attend - unregistered siblings and other children will not be allowed to attend. The adventure begins on the west side of Quarry Hill Park, 2100 9th St. NE, Rochester, not at the Nature Center.

June 4 or 5: Salamander Salute

Salute the salamander and learn all about this wet, wild and wonderful animal. Meet our live salamander and head into the woods in search of more "tigers". A muddy craft and snack fit for a salamander will complete our adventure.

June 18 or 19: Knock Knock Woodpecker

Who is that knock knocking in the woods? Downy, Hairy, Pileated, what makes these birds so special? Use your eyes and ears as we search for woodpeckers in the park and their signature mark on trees. Then enjoy a snack suitable for "pecky" eaters.

July 9 or 10: Flying Dragons

Did you know that flying dragons exist? They do! We call them dragonflies and they hatch right out of the water. Gather around the pond to learn all about the lifecycle of the dragonfly. Snack & craft fit for a dragon.

How to Register:

Registration is accepted online only. Camp registration is not accepted by phone or mail. If you require assistance with online registration, please call 507-328-3950 Mon - Fri from 9 am - 4 pm. Full payment is required at the time of registration. A one-time fee of \$3 per camper will be added to the total camp fee. Scholarships are available for camp, see details below.

When to Register:

Member Priority Registration: March 5-13 Open Enrollment begins March 14.

All campers registered before May 20 are guaranteed a camp t-shirt and will receive it on the first day of camp.

Wait List:

You can add your camper to a wait list at no charge. If space becomes available, campers on a wait list will be contacted in the order their registrations were received. Please provide an email address you frequently check so you can be reached. Campers are encouraged to register for wait lists in any sessions they are able to attend.

Scholarships:

Friends of Quarry Hill Nature Center is committed to making camp accessible for all. Scholarships are available for camp. Any child whose family meets the income eligibility guidelines for the Educational Benefits from the MN Department of Education (formerly the Free & Reduced Lunch Program) qualifies for a camp scholarship. Income eligibility guidelines can be found here.

A non-refundable fee of \$20 is required to attend any camp with a regular fee of \$120 or less (or $\frac{1}{2}$ of the listed fee for camps over \$120).

Limit one scholarship per camper/per summer.

Cancellations:

Requests for cancellations made at least 3 weeks prior to your camp session start date are eligible for a 75% refund. Cancellations made less than 3 weeks prior to your camp start date are not refundable.

Campers withdrawing before the start of camp due to a medical emergency are encouraged to re-schedule in a session with availability If unable to reschedule, camp fees (less a \$20 processing fee/per camp) will be refunded.

Camp registrations are non-transferrable

Session Changes:

Campers requesting a session change must call the Nature Center office. Requests made after May 1 will incur a \$10 fee per change/per camper. Session change requests will only be considered if they are made 2 weeks before the start date of your camp session.

QUARRY HILL SUMMER NATURE DAY CAMP FAQ'S

Can I request to be in the same group as my friend?

Yes. Both campers must request each other to ensure placement in the same camp group.

How big will my camper's group size be?

Low camp to staff ratio is part of the Quarry Hill camp experience. Entering grades K-6 camp groups consist of 12 or less campers and are led by a staff member and a high school student assistant. Entering grades 7-9 camp groups are up to 16 campers and led by two staff members.

Can I register my camper for more than one camp?

Yes, if there is more than one camp offering for the grade your camper is entering.

Are the camps the same each week?

Yes, camps run more than one session and have the same activities each time.

Can my camper repeat a camp?

While camp is designed for a single session, some campers enjoy repeating camp. We allow repeat camps, however we ask that there be at least 2 weeks between repeat camps.

Do you have extended day options?

No, extended day options and supervision between camp sessions is not available. Quarry Hill campers should arrive and be picked up according to camp session start and end times.

What do I need to know before registering my special needs camper?

We are happy to make reasonable accommodations for special needs. Parents and guardians with questions regarding the ability of camp staff to meet a child's needs must contact the camp director before registering for camp.

Campers who require an aide in their school setting must be accompanied by an aide at camp. It is the responsibility of the camper's family to provide this aide. Due to group size restrictions, the Quarry Hill office needs to be made aware of any camper that will be accompanied by an aide prior to registration to ensure the group enrollment is within guidelines.

What should my camper bring to camp?

Campers should dress for the weather in comfortable clothing. Clothing and shoes may get dirty and wet.
Campers should bring a water bottle, filled with water only, everyday.

What if it rains?

If there is no threat of severe weather, we will continue outdoor activities. In the event of inclement weather that prevents outdoor activity, camps will move indoors for alternate activities

What are your camp safety protocols?

Safety is a priority at camp. All staff have first aid training and are trained in safety protocol for all camp activities.
